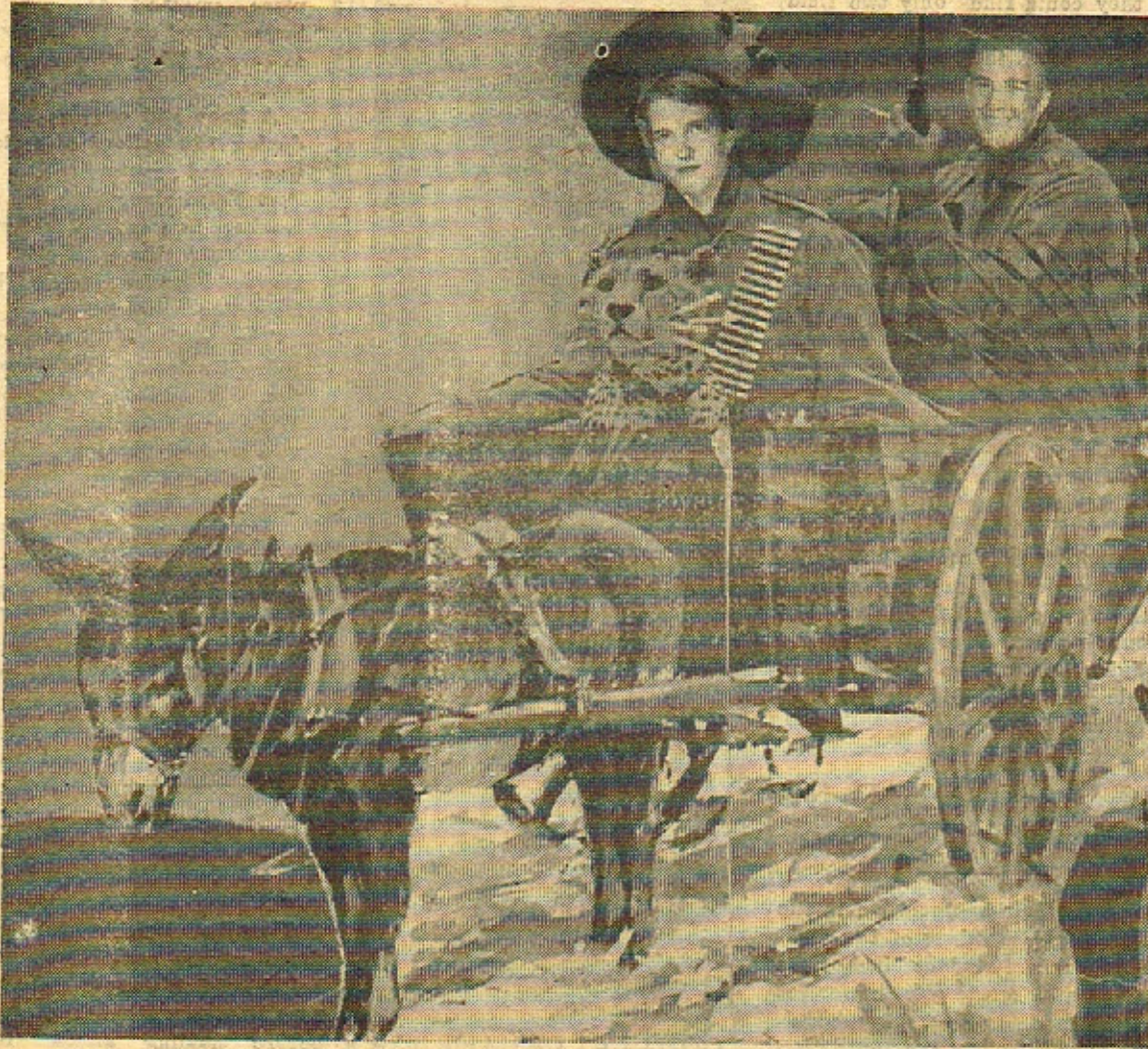


Bailey-Simmons Bed Bug Expedition To Leave From Poor Farm To-Day

One of the strangest and costliest expeditions in history will shove off from the Poor Farm today in search of a new type bedbug powder, which, it is hoped, will bring relief to thousands who suffer from the bite of the insect.

Leapin' Lestelle To Make Sensational Buzzard Rock Jump

Leapin' Lestelle Murphy, Glenville high school student council adviser, will risk her neck for "my dear old council members" in a daring running leap from Buzzard's Rock near Glenville tomorrow afternoon, announces Council President Walter Marks.

School will be dismissed at 12:30, says Principal Stennett, and all students who have bought \$1 tickets will be transported by school bus to the jump-off spot, where the heroine is scheduled to start running for the ledge at 1:05.

The devoted adviser at first contemplated using a regulation parachute, but gave it up when her advisers suggested that the council would net more profits if "you will just haul off and jump over the high 100 ft. precipice."

Council members have tearfully begged their sponsor to cancel her jump, or at least use a parachute, but her parrot-like routine remark was "The council needs the money, so I'll jump."

The counsellor plans to start running for the ledge about 110 ft. away at 1:05.

Typical westerners, the big buggers, Bailey and Simmons, yesterday joined in a big celebration commemorating the start of the world-famous expedition, and Simmons sang on a nationally televised program the famous song, "Go On With The Wedding" as a tribute to his bug-hunting 'pardner.' Bailey brought down the house with her rendition of "The Great Speckled Bird."

Thousands of covered wagons pulled by sway-backed mule trains lined the staging area at the Center yesterday as far as the eye could see, and equipment for the searching party began pouring in this morning from the Blue Ribbon factory.

"We'll find the bed bug powder for sure," says Bailey, but reporters (Continued on page 4)

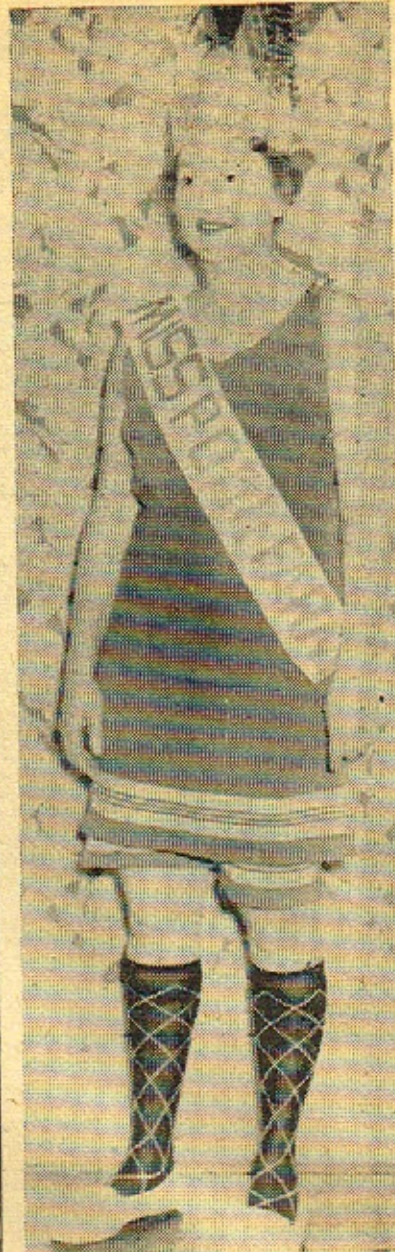
Ninth Grade Girls Use Wash Tubs In Search For Points

at one o'clock," announced Mrs. Lestell Murphy.

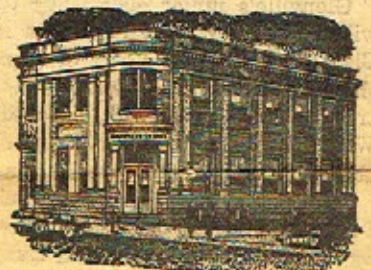
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
